Who is First Step for?

- Children, Young People and their parent/carers living in and registered with a GP in the Black Country.
- Children and Young People under the age of 18 who have been sexually abused.

What is counselling?

Counselling provides a confidential, safe and regular space for you to talk and explore what you think and feel with someone who is trained to listen to you. It can help you to...

- **Deal with difficult or painful feelings**
- **Understand yourself and make sense of your experience**
- **Find your own solution to what you want to change**
- **Feel more confident**

Counselling is a choice: you choose if you want to come, and what you want to talk about.

Our aims

Our aim is to promote the recovery and increase the resilience of children and young people impacted by sexual abuse.

What you can expect at your first visit

After you (or someone on your behalf) have got in touch with us, you will be invited to come and meet us.

You can bring someone with you for the first visit if you wish.

A counsellor at First Step will spend time with you to explain about how we work and some of the things we do.



How to access the service

In order for a child or young person to engage with support, consent must be obtained from parents/carers.

Referrals can be submitted by professionals and agencies.

Self-referrals can be made by parents/carers.
